

2009/2010 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING JUNIOR PLAYER MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

This form is to be used **ONLY** for Junior age participants (18 years or younger).

This form has been set up so that individuals may insert their personal information by filling in the individual fields with text or by clicking on a box and then printing out the form. If possible print pages 2&3 of this document (individual membership form) as a double sided document. Also included is a copy of the code of conduct (page 4) that should be read and kept by each individual for their own personal reference as well as the Medical Release form (NOTE: if a team is traveling at any time to compete in FLORIDA the Medical Release form WITH Notary must be used instead— that form can be found on our website under Publications-the Forms-then Juniors).

Instructions:

- Each participant must complete the Individual Membership Form:
Make sure that all information requested is provided, especially:
 1. **LEGAL** first names— refrain from using Joe, Bob, Katie, Maggie etc unless these are the Legal first names.
 2. Date of Birth
 3. Club Name (and Team Name if known)
 4. High School graduation year and Current Grade in School (see below for chart of graduation years)
- Each participant and their parent/guardian must read and sign the Waiver and Release Liability, and the Participant Code of Conduct sections on the back side of the individual membership form as well as the media release found on the front of the form.
- If you turn in membership forms that are not double sided, please **STAPLE** the 2 pages together! (pages 2 & 3)
- Junior members should return the completed individual membership form, Medical Release form along with all other documents required by the individual club/region to the Club Director or designated individual of the club. The Clubs are responsible for sending in the forms and registration fees to the Region. Membership cards will be sent to the Club Director for distribution as they see fit. (some clubs give the membership cards directly to the individuals, others have the coach retain them for safekeeping)

Make sure each form is filled out completely—if you use a pre-printed form instead of the attached fill in version make sure that they are **LEGIBLE!** **Print in Black or Blue Ink ONLY please!!!!**

SECTION II**USA VOLLEYBALL PARTICIPANT CODES OF CONDUCT****THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS ARE PROHIBITED:**

1. Violation of any anti-doping policies, protocols or procedures as defined by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), Federation Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB), US Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) or the United States Olympic Committee (USOC). Violations of this provision will be adjudicated only by USADA or the proper anti-doping authority, not USA Volleyball (USAV).
2. Possession, consumption or distribution of alcohol and/or tobacco if illegal or in violation of USA Volleyball (USAV) or Regional Volleyball Association (RVA) policy.
3. USAV policy prohibits the possession, consumption or distribution of alcohol and/or tobacco by anyone registered as a Junior Olympic Volleyball Player at the event venue of any USAV/RVA sanctioned junior event.
4. Use of a recognized identification card by anyone other than the individual described on the card.
5. Physical damage to a facility or theft of items from a room, dormitory, residence or other person. (Restitution will be part of any penalty imposed.)
6. Possession of fireworks, ammunition, firearms, or other weapons or any item or material which by commonly accepted practices and principles would be a hazard or harmful to other persons at USAV/RVA sanctioned events.
7. Any action considered to be an offense under Federal, State or local law ordinances.
8. Violation of the specific policies, regulations, and/or procedures of the USAV, RVA or the facility used in conjunction with a sanctioned event. (It is the responsibility of the individual to be familiar with applicable specific policies, regulations and procedures.)
9. Conduct which is inappropriate as determined by comparison to normally accepted behavior.
10. Physical or verbal intimidation of any individual.
11. Actions that will be detrimental to USAV or the RVA.

	After event concludes	The individual may be declared ineligible for USAV registration or RVA membership for two years starting from the date of infraction.
Third		Individual may be declared ineligible for USAV registration or RVA membership for the remainder of his/her lifetime.
NOTE :		Major misbehavior (e.g. verbal or physical abuse of a child, sexual harassment, etc.) may subject the violator to a lifetime ineligibility for USAV registration or RVA membership after the first infraction.

Penalties are only applied after affording the participant due process may be required by the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act (TSOASA), USOC, USAV, and RVA. Appeals, other than for doping violations, may be made in accordance with procedures set forth in the bylaws and operating codes of USA Volleyball and the RVA as printed in the current *Official USA Volleyball Guide* and RVA Handbook, respectively.

I hereby take the following action for myself, my executors, administrators, heirs, next of kin, successors and assigns: a) I WAIVE, RELEASE, AND DISCHARGE from any and all claims or liabilities for death or personal injury or damages of any kind, EXCEPT THAT WHICH IS THE RESULT OF GROSS NEGLIGENCE AND/OR WANTON MISCONDUCT OF PERSONS OR ENTITIES LISTED BELOW, which arise out of or relate to my traveling to and from or my participation in any volleyball event, THE FOLLOWING PERSONS OR ENTITIES: USA Volleyball and its Regional Volleyball Associations, tournament directors, sponsors, and the officers, directors, employees, representatives, and agents of any of the above; b) I AGREE NOT TO SUE any of the persons or entities listed above for any of the claims or liabilities that I have waived, released or discharged herein; and c) I INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS the persons or entities mentioned above from any claims made or liabilities assessed against them as a result of my actions.

In consideration of the rights granted to me by my membership with the Regional Volleyball Association (RVA), a USA Volleyball (USAV) RVA member, I consent to abide by the rules of conduct set forth herein, while I am a member of the RVA. I understand that these rules extend to my conduct in activities related to, and during any USAV/RVA sanctioned event in which I participate. This includes all events or activities sanctioned or sponsored by the RVAs or the USAV, practices, travel to and from events, volleyball camps, players' clinics and officials' clinics. 1. I am aware that recruiting a committed club player is illegal. My committed club player, son/daughter, has not been recruited by any club personnel to play in the Great Lakes Region.
2. I am aware that no individual under the direction of club personnel may contact a player who has committed to another club, either verbally or in writing, for the purpose of persuading them to leave the club they have committed to or have represented during the previous season.
3. To the best of our knowledge I am not in debt to any club in the Great Lakes Region. I understand that if a debt is owed to any Great Lakes Region Club my son/daughter may be rejected by the new club until the previous club's debt is paid.
4. My son/daughter has received no promises of money, gifts or improper incentives to play for a junior club.
5. I have carefully read through all pertinent documents supplied by the Club; i.e., contracts, club rules, regulations and financial disclosures). I understand and accept all financial obligations as outlined by the Junior Club my son/daughter has chosen to represent and have received copies of all documents.
6. I understand that once my son/daughter represents a club in a "Sanctioned USAV Tournament," they are committed to that team/club for the entire season. For further clarification please refer to the USAV Guide concerning rules and regulations governing registration at www.usavolleyball.org.
7. My son/daughter and I understand the club's philosophy regarding playing time, team placement, starting position, extra practice and outside weight training opportunities. If promises were made prior to committing to a club/team, I have all information in writing.
8. My son/daughter and I understand that the Great Lakes Region has a zero tolerance policy against any unsportsmanlike conduct. We further understand that if anyone approaches a coach, player, official, work team member, or facility personnel in an unsportsmanlike manner, they will be asked to leave immediately and sanctions may be imposed.
9. My son/daughter and I understand that many USAV Great Lakes Region facilities have a "no outside food and no coolers allowed rule." We know that anyone found to be in violation of this rule will be asked to leave the facility immediately and sanctions may be imposed.
10. I am aware that I should read the most current information concerning regional matters posted on the Great Lakes Region website @ www.greatlakesvolleyball.org throughout the season.

Definitions of Terminology

Club Personnel is defined as the following:

- A registered adult member of a Junior Club in the Great Lakes Region, including but not limited to club directors, coaches and chaperones.

Prospective Club Player is defined as the following:

- A junior athlete who solicits information about a club either personally or through their parent/guardian;
- A junior athlete who did not play with any USAV Junior Club in the previous season;
- A junior athlete who has never played USAV Junior Club.

Committed Club Player is defined as the following:

- A junior athlete who has played in a USAV Sanctioned event in the current season;
- A junior athlete who has played with a USAV Junior Club in the previous season.

Note: A prospective OR committed junior athlete may solicit information from any club either personally or through their parent/guardian.

Marketing is defined as the following:

- A legal tool of promoting a USAV Junior Club through flyers, brochures, newspaper ads, direct mailing to an entire demographic area when addressed to “occupant,” camps, clinics or private lessons. *No unsolicited information may be given concerning a Junior Club when holding a camp, clinic or private lesson.*

Recruitment is defined as the following:

- Personal correspondence with a committed USAV Junior Club player via mail, email, telephone, text message, fax or face-to-face contact.
